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Where Do Coins Come From?



For centuries, coins have been used as a form of money around the world. In the United States, we use coins for many things – spending, saving, collecting, and some might even toss one in a fountain for good luck. Have you ever wondered how coins came about and who makes them?

Well, the United States Mint is the government agency that makes coins and is responsible for designing, producing, circulating, and retiring coins. During colonial times, people used livestock, coins from other countries, or crops to pay each other for goods and services. In 1792,

Thomas Jefferson and Congress decided to create one standard currency system for the country, and the United States Mint was born. Our most used coins are the penny, nickel, dime, and quarter, but the Mint also makes half-dollar and dollar coins.

The Mint has six locations, each with a different purpose. For example, the Mint in Denver, Colorado makes circulating and collectible coins, while the Mint in San Francisco, California only makes collectible coins. No coins are made in the Mint in Washington, DC. This location is the headquarters of the United States Mint and is where research and other business is done.
